c. That portion of the right half of the roadway not otherwise designated for left turn and right turn as set forth in paragraphs a. and b. shall be restricted for thru traffic proceeding in a southerly direction at the intersection of Franklin Street and North Main Streets.

Section 2. The Village of Centerville may cause such signs to be placed directing such traffic to comply with Section 1. herein.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 4-1965

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 13-1959 AND ORDINANCE 10-1961 SECTION 2 (a) INCREASING PERMIT FEE REQUIRED

BE IT ORDAINED by the COUNCIL of the VILLAGE of CENTERVILLE, OHIO, that:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of Ordinance Number 13-1959, as amended by Ordinance Number 10-1961 Section 2 (a), reads as follows:

"Section 2 (a) The person, firm or corporation desiring to acquire such a permit for the purpose of tapping into or connecting with any sanitary sewer line shall make application, in writing, to the Chairman of the Street Committee of the Village of Centerville. Before the Street Committee shall issue such permit, the applicant shall be required to pay a permit fee of Twenty (\$20.00) Dollars to cover necessary administrative and engineering expenses and to deposit the sum of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars. The permit fee and the deposit so required shall be paid in cash, certified check or
