

and with the east line of said Section 18 to the south line of land belonging to Mildred L. Fisher and the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of said Section 18; thence westwardly with the south line of the north half of said Section 18 to the southwest corner of the northwest quarter of said Section 18; thence westwardly with the south line of the north half of said Section 24 to said Centerville Corporation line and the southwest corner of the northwest quarter of said Section 24; thence northwardly with said Centerville Corporation line and with the west line of said Section 24 to the point of beginning containing one thousand ninety-eight and 645/1000 (1098.645) acres more or less.

WHEREAS, said Board of County Commissioners of Montgomery County, after public hearing, did on July 3rd, 1961, by its Resolution No. 915, approve said petition and the annexation there-under;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the said application and petition of a majority of the resident free holders for the annexation of the territory above described in the County of Montgomery and adjacent to the Village of Centerville be, and the same is, hereby accepted.

Section 2. That a certified transcript of the proceedings of the said County Commissioners in relation thereto be retained in the records of the Village and on file with the Clerk of the Council of Centerville.

Section 3. That the Clerk of this Village be, and he is hereby directed to make the required filing with the Secretary of State for the State of Ohio relating to such annexation of said territory to the Village of Centerville, Ohio.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1 - 1962
VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF AND TO FIX THE SALARY OF THE VILLAGE SOLICITOR AND TO RATIFY AND APPROVE THE APPOINTMENT OF MR. WILLIAM WISEMAN AS SUCH VILLAGE SOLICITOR.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO:

Section 1. That the Village of Centerville, Ohio, shall be authorized to employ a qualified person to serve as the Village Solicitor, who shall be an Attorney at Law, admitted to practice in the Courts of Ohio. Such Solicitor shall be employed by the Council for a period not exceeding two years.

Section 2. That it shall be the duty of such Solicitor to act as Attorney for the Village and the Officers thereof in their official capacities, and as such attorney, prepare Ordinances, Resolutions and legal opinions to the Council or any Officer of the Village, upon request in writing.

Section 3. That compensation to the Village Solicitor, for his professional services, shall be as follows:

Attendance at one regular meeting per month; rendering legal opinion, either written or oral, as requested; preparation of Village Ordinances and Resolutions,
Annual Fee\$800.00

Fees for services rendered in addition to the above named normal services shall be charged in accordance with the Dayton Bar Association minimum fee schedule. In the event the fee for a particular service is not established by the Dayton Bar Association minimum fee schedule, the charge shall be predicated on an hourly fee basis, in accordance with the Dayton Bar Association hourly rate, by using the minimum fee rate as a maximum fee charge.

Section 4. That the appointment of William Wiseman, as Attorney-At-Law,

1962, is hereby ratified, approved and confirmed and he shall continue to serve as provided by law.

Section 5. This ordinance is passed as an emergency measure under the law of the State of Ohio, the existing emergency being the immediate need for continuous legal services by competent and qualified personnel.

Section 6. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be repealed and this ordinance shall take effect from and after the 3rd day of January, 1962.

ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE (VILLAGE)

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, STATE OF OHIO, DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31st, 1962.

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, That, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the said Village of Centerville during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1962, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows, viz:
