Section 1. And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board of officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon appeal of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 21. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 3-1961

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE SALARY STRUCTURE AND RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR THE VILLAGE MARSHAL AND VILLAGE DEPUTY MARSHAL OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio:

Section 1. Amending and substituting for Ordinance No. 6, 1959, to the effect hereinafter stated, it is ordained that effective January 1st, 1961, the salary of the Village Marshal of Centerville, Ohio, shall be Five Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty (\$5,750.00) Dollars annually, payable in equal monthly installments.

Section 2. Amending and substituting for Ordinance No. 1, 1961, to the effect hereinafter stated, it is ordained that effective January 1st, 1961, the salary of the Village Deputy Marshal of Centerville, Ohio, shall be Four Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty (\$4,830.00) Dollars annually, payable in equal monthly installments.

Section 3. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be repealed and this ordinance shall take effect at the earliest possible date, as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 4-1961
VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT, SALARY, RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS AND BOND OF A VILLAGE PATROLMAN.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the office of Village Patrolman is hereby created.

Section 2. That the appointment to said office shall be made by the Mayor of the Village of Centerville, subject to the confirmation by the Council of the Village of Centerville, as provided for by Ohio Revised Code Section 737.16. Said appointment shall be for a probationary period of six (6) months' continuous service, as required in Ohio Revised Code 737.17.

Section 3. That the salary of each officer appointed Village Patrolman shall be Four Thousand Three Hundred (4,300.00) Dollars, on an annual basis during the probationary period as hereinabove provided, and Four Thousand Four Hundred (\$4,400.00) Dollars, on an annual basis thereafter, said sum to be payable monthly.

Section 4. That the officer so appointed need not be an elector of the Village
