AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE SALARY STRUCTURE AND RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR THE VILLAGE MARSHAL AND VILLAGE DEPUTY MARSHAL OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio:

Section 1. Amending and substituting for Ordinance No. 6, 1959, to the effect hereinafter stated, it is ordained that effective January 1st, 1961, the salary of the Village Marshal of Centerville, Ohio, shall be Five Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty (\$5,750.00) Dollars annually, payable in equal monthly installments.

Section 2. Amending and substituting for Ordinance No. 1, 1961, to the effect hereinafter stated, it is ordained that effective January 1st, 1961, the salary of the Village Deputy Marshal of Centerville, Ohio, shall be Four Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty (\$4,830.00) Dollars annually, payable in equal monthly installments.

Section 3. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be repealed and this ordinance shall take effect at the earliest possible date, as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 4-1961
VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT, SALARY, RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS AND BOND OF A VILLAGE PATROLMAN.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the office of Village Patrolman is hereby created.

Section 2. That the appointment to said office shall be made by the Mayor of the Village of Centerville, subject to the confirmation by the Council of the Village of Centerville, as provided for by Ohio Revised Code Section 737.16. Said appointment shall be for a probationary period of six (6) months' continuous service, as required in Ohio Revised Code 737.17.

Section 3. That the salary of each officer appointed Village Patrolman shall be Four Thousand Three Hundred (4,300.00) Dollars, on an annual basis during the probationary period as hereinabove provided, and Four Thousand Four Hundred (\$4,400.00) Dollars, on an annual basis thereafter, said sum to be payable monthly.

Section 4. That the officer so appointed need not be an elector of the Village

of Centerville.

Section 5. That the officer so appointed shall give bond in the sum of \$1,000.00.

Section 6. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be repealed and this ordinance shall take effect immediately, the same being passed as an emergency measure, as provided by the statutes of Ohio, the said emergency existing by reason of the necessity of strengthening police protection in the interest of public welfare and safety.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 16-1959, AS IT RELATES TO DRIVING WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL, BY ADDING SEC. 22.23.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio:

Section 1. Amending Ordinance No. 16-1959, by adding the following:

Sec. 22.23. Driving While Under the Influence of Alcohol.

No person who is under the influence of alcohol in any form whatsoever, narcotic drugs or opiates shall operate any vehicle upon the streets or alleys of the Village of Centerville.

Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be fined not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars.

Section 2. That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
