ORDINANCE NUMBER 6-1961
VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE AN UNNAMED STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

WHEREAS, on the 6th day of February, 1961, a petition by all persons owning land adjacent to an unnamed street, running in a North and South direction, extending from the center line of East Franklin Street on the North to the easterly extension of the North line of Lot No. 124 in Weidner's Second Addition Plat, as recorded in Plat Book "Z" Page 96, of the Plat Records of Montgomery County, Ohio, described as follows:

"Situated in the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and State of Ohio. Located in Section 30, Town 3, Range 5 MRs., Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio and being the vacation of part of a twenty-five (25) foot unnamed street along the East side of Weidners Second Addition to Village of Centerville as recorded in Book Z, Page 96 in the Plat Records of Montgomery County, Ohio, and being that part of said unnamed street extending from the centerline of East Franklin Street southwardly to the easterly extension of the north line of Lot 124 in said Weidners Second Addition."

was duly presented to the Council, praying that said unnamed street be vacated; and notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been dispensed with, in as much as all persons owning property abutting the unnamed street proposed to be vacated have signed said petition; and

WHEREAS, the Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation, as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, Ohio:

Section 1. That the following described unnamed street, to wit:

AMENDED ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE
 (VILLAGE)

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, STATE OF OHIO, DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31st, 1961.

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, That, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the said Village of Centerville during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1961, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows, viz:

Section 2. That there be appropriated from the GENERAL FUND:

That there be transferred from the GENERAL FUND to the SAFETY FUND the sum of \$31,940.50 (if revenues from sources other than taxes are to be deposited in Safety, Service, etc., Funds as heretofore, an Ordinance to this effect must be passed by Council, Sec. 5705.12 R.C.); and that there be appropriated from said SAFETY FUND the following:
