AMENDED ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE  
 (VILLAGE)

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, STATE OF OHIO, DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31st, 1961.

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, That, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the said Village of Centerville during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1961, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows, viz:

And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon appeal of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 21. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE ENACTED BY THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO, IN THE MATTER OF THE HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED IMPROVEMENT, UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE DIRECTOR OF HIGHWAYS.

WHEREAS, the Director of Highways is considering improving a portion of the public highway which is described as follows:

Widening Main Street, (S.R.#48) from a 20 ft. width to a 24 ft. width and resurfacing it with asphaltic concrete from the South corporation line of Centerville Northerly approximately 1.04 miles.
