ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE (VILLAGE)

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO, DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31st, 1960.

Section I. Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, that, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the said Village of Centerville during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1960, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows, viz:

Section II. That there be appropriated from the GENERAL FUND:

And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon appeal of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 21. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CERTAIN PROCEDURES IN ORDINANCE NUMBER 13, 1959, PROVIDING FOR OBTAINING PERMITS RELATIVE TO DIGGING AND EXCAVATION INTO ANY STREET, SIDEWALK, SIDEWALK SPACE, ALLEY OR PUBLIC WAY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, Ohio:

Section 1. That Section 2 of Ordinance No. 13-1959, be amended to read as follows:

Section 2. The person, firm or corporation desiring to acquire such a permit shall make application, in writing, to the Chairman of the Street Committee of the Village of Centerville. Before the Street Committee shall issue such permit, the applicant shall be required to pay a permit fee of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) to cover necessary administrative and engineering expenses and to deposit the sum of
