AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, STATE OF OHIO, DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31st, 1959.

SECTION I. Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, that, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the said Village of Centerville, during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1959, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows, viz:

SECTION 2. And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon appeal of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

SECTION 21. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 11-1959  
VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE CONTRACTING FOR THE COLLECTION OF GARBAGE AND RUBBISH IN THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the granting of an exclusive franchise to an independent contractor for the collection of all residential and commercial garbage and residential and commercial rubbish generated within the Village of Centerville, Ohio.

Section 2. That the Clerk-Treasurer of the Village of Centerville, Ohio be and he hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids to collect residential and commercial garbage and residential and commercial rubbish on the terms and conditions which have this day been presented to this Council.

Section 3. The foregoing ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately upon its passage, the said emergency which is found and declared to exist being the immediate need for proper and efficient regulation and collection of garbage and rubbish within the Village to insure the public health and welfare.
