inclusive of the cost of engineering, contingencies and other incidental expenses.

SECTION 3 (Authority to Sign). That the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of said Village, is hereby authorized to enter into maintenance and parking agreements and special contractual obligations.

SECTION 4 (Maintenance). That it is hereby agreed that said Village will, after completion of the aforementioned project, maintain the improvement herein contemplated in accordance with the provisions of the statutes relating thereto and will make ample financial and other provisions for such maintenance, and maintain the right of way and keep it free of obstructions in a manner satisfactory to the State of Ohio.

SECTION 5 (Parking Regulations). That upon completion of said improvement, said Village, will thereafter (a) Keep said highway open to traffic at all times; and (b) Regulate parking in the following manner: No parking on traveled portion of pavement.

SECTION 6 (Certification of Availability of Right of Way, Utility Rearrangement and Saving the State of Chio Harmless of Damages). (a) That all existing right of way within the Village, which is necessary for the aforesaid improvement, shall be made available therefor. (c) That arrangements have been or will be made with and agreements obtained from all public utility companies whose lines or structures will be affected by the said improvement and said companies have agreed to make any and all necessary plant removals or rearrangements in such a manner as to be clear of any construction called for by the plans of said improvement and said companies have agreed to make such necessary rearrangements immediately after notification by said village or the Department of Highways. (d) That it is hereby agreed that the village shall at its own expense, make all rearrangements of water mains, service lines, fire hydrants, valve boxes, sanitary sewers or other municipally owned utilities and/or any appurtenances thereto, whether inside or outside the corporate limits, as may be necessary to conform to the said improvement and said rearrangements shall be done at such time as requested by the Department of Highways Engineer. (e) That the construction, reconstruction, and/or rearrangemen of both publicly and privately owned utilities, referred to in subsections (b) and (c) above, shall be done in such a manner as not to interfere unduly with the operation of the contractor constructing the improvement and all backfilling of trenches made necessary by such utility rearrangements shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of Section 1-2.06 of the Ohio Department of Highways Construction and Material Specifications and shall be subject to approval by the State. (f) That said village hereby agrees that the said department of highways of the State of Ohio, shall be and is hereby saved harmless from any and all damages or claims thereof arising from or growing out of the certification or obligations made or agreed to in Sections (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) hereinabove.

SECTION 7 (Emergency Clause). This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure by reason of the need for expediting construction of project(s) to promote highway safety, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

## ORDINANCE NUMBER 7-1956 VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL PARKING OF VEHICLES UPON A CERTAIN PUBLIC WAY WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

WHEREAS, the certain road space and parking area lying adjacent to and along the length of the south side of the Washington Township Hall, a public building, is subject to the authority and control of this Council; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that the length of time during which a vehicle may be parked and remain parked shall be limited,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Centerville, Ohio.

SECTION 1. Except on each Sunday and each legal holiday as designated so by the Legislature of the State of Ohio, during the hours beginning 6:00 a.m. o'clock until 6:00 p.m. o'clock, the length of time for which a vehicle may remain parked within the parking spaces delineated with the said road space above described, shall be limited to a consecutive and uninterupted period of two (2) hours.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful to park or to permit a vehicle to be or to remain parked in any manner contrary to Section 1 hereof, and violation of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed Five (\$5.00) Dollars for each separate offense.

SECTION 3. This ordinance is passed as an emergency measure pursuant to the statutes of the State of Ohio provided and shall become effective immediately upon its proper passage. Such emergency exists by reason of traffic congestion and hazard caused by limited parking areas available in the business zone of the Village. This ordinance is passed this 5th day of November, 1956.

## ORDINANCE NUMBER 1-1957 VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF AND TO FIX THE SALARY OF THE VILLAGE ENGINEER

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Village of Centerville, Ohio, shall be authorized to employ a qualified person to serve as the Village Engineer.

SECTION 2. That the Village Engineer shall be a civil engineer, so licensed to practice such profession by the State of Ohio; that he shall serve under the authority of, and subject to the direction and control of the Village Council, and that his tenure shall be subject to the discretion of said Council.

SECTION 3. That the duties of the Village Engineer shall be the inspection of all construction within the Village, as directed by Council, the Village Planning Commission, or deleged representatives or committees of either acting within the scope of their authority, as may relate directly or indirectly to the enforcement of the zoning ordinances or building code of said Village, or such other ordinances for the promotion of the public safety, health or welfare within the Village of Centerville.

SECTION 4. That the compensation to the Village Engineer for his professional services shall be a salary or retainer of not less than ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS per annum, the rate of compensation to be fixed and earned in accordance with the following schedule: Attendance at meetings with the Council, Village Officials

> or Boards - \$5.00. Building permit inspection, each lot - \$5.00.

Hourly rate, other professional service and consulation -\$5.00 per hour; minimum charge of \$20.00 for each individual

and separate assignment of work or consulation. SECTION 5. This ordinance is passed as an emergency measure under the law of the State

of Ohio, the existing emergency being the immediate need for continuous engineering services by competent and qualified personnel.
