ORDINANCE NUMBER 11-1954

VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE

AN ORDINANCE TO FIX THE RATE OF HOURLY COMPENSATION FOR CASUAL LABORERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1-1955

VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

AN ORDINANCE TO COMBINE THE DUTIES OF THE CLERK AND THE DUTIES OF THE TREASURER OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO INTO ONE OFFICE TO BE KNOWN AS THE OFFICE OF CLERK-TREASURER:

WHEREAS, The Ohio General Assembly has by legislative enactment effective October 2, 1953 (Revised Code Section 733.261) authorized the legislative authority of a village to combine the duties of the Clerk and the Treasurer into one office, to be known as the Clerk-Treasurer; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the public interest to combine the offices and duties of the Clerk and the Treasurer into one office;

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, Ohio, that:

Section 1. The office of the Clerk of this Village, and the office of the Treasurer of this Village and the respective duties of such offices, shall be combined into one office, to be known as Clerk-Treasurer.

Section 2. The Salary to be paid to the duly elected and qualified Clerk-Treasurer of the Village of Centerville, Ohio, shall be the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY (\$750.00) DOLLARS per annum.

Section 3. The Clerk-Treasurer shall perform the duties provided by law for the Clerk and the Treasurer.

Section 4. This combination of offices into the single office of Clerk-Treasurer shall be effective on the first day of January, 1956, and a Clerk-Treasurer shall be elected at the next regular municipal election in the manner provided by law.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be repealed, and this ordinance shall take effect from and after the earliest period provided by law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2, 1955

VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND MODIFY ORDINANCE NUMBER 6-1952 OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO.

WHEREAS, Ordinance Number 6-1952, Village of Centerville, Ohio, passed June 9, 1952, is currently in effect and is an ordinance to regulate and establish standard specifications for the construction of streets and roadways within the said Village of Centerville; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the public interest that said Ordinance Number 6-1952 should be amended and modified so as to require the construction of street curbs of concrete manufacture as a necessary and concomitant part of proper street and roadway construction; and

WHEREAS, it is determined that proper drainage and street maintenance cannot be achieved unless proper concrete curbing is installed in connection with the construction of streets and roadways;

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, Ohio.

Section 1. That the standard specifications for new streets and roadways for Centerville, Ohio, shall be and are amended so that all streets and roadways constructed within the Village of Centerville shall be buttressed with concrete curbing laterally on both sides of the said street or roadway.

Section 2. Such concrete curbing shall be constructed prior to the installation of the street or roadway in accordance with the said standard specifications for new streets and roadways.

Section 3. Such concrete curbing shall be of form, design, and component materials, amounts and proportions as shall be determined by the Village Planning Commission of the Village of Centerville, Ohio, in its discretion and depending upon the grade, terrain features and conditions existing in each area of street and roadway construction. No street or roadway shall be hereafter constructed within the Village of Centerville, Ohio, without the installation of concrete curbing of design and construction first approved by the said Village Planning Commission

Section 4. This ordinance is supplemental to Ordinance Number 6-1952, being an ordinance to regulate and establish standard specifications for the construction of streets and roadways within the said Village of Centerville and shall not in any manner be deemed to exclude or eliminate the requirements of said Ordinance Number 6-1952. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith shall, however, be repealed, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period provided by law.
