ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE
(Village)

Gen'l Code, Sec. 5625-29.

An Ordinance to make Appropriations for Current Expenses and other Expenditures of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1955.

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, That, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the Said Village of Centerville during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1955, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows, viz:

Section 2. And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon appeal of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 21. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 4 - 1955

VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO

An Ordinance to Fix the Salary of the Superintendent of Water Works for the Village of Centerville, Ohio.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: That the salary of the Superintendent of Water Works shall be Two Thousand Four Hundred (\$2,400.00) Dollars per annum, payable monthly at the rate of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars per month from the funds arising from the operation and management of the Village Water Works by the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs of the Village of Centerville.

SECTION 2: That the said Water Works Superintendent shall serve under the authority of, and subject to the control of the Board of Trustees, of Public Affairs of the Village of Centerville, and that his tenure also shall be subject to the discretion of said Board; it being the purpose and intent of this Ordinance to make no contractual obligation beyond December 31, 1955, and tenure of said Water Works superintendency shall be on a month-to-month basis only.

SECTION 3. In the event that said Water Works system and the management and control thereof is transferred from the Village of Centerville to any other governmental unit, then this Ordinance shall be immediately void upon completion of said sale and transfer.

SECTION 4. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be repealed, and that this Ordinance shall take effect from and after the first day of January, 1955.
