

ORDINANCE NO. 1 - 1952

ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE

(Village)

Gen'l Code, Sec. 5624-29.

An Ordinance to make Appropriations for Current Expenses and other Expenditures of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1952.

Section 1. Be It Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, That, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the said Village of Centerville during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1952, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows, viz:

Section 2. That there be appropriated from the GENERAL FUND:

A. GENERAL FUND

Table with 2 columns: Item description and Amount. Items include Council (\$300.00), Mayor (500.00), Clerk (200.00), Treasurer (130.00), Solicitor (500.00), Building Inspector (70.00), and Legal Advertising. Total General Fund: \$1,700.00

Section 4. That there be transferred from the GENERAL FUND to the SAFETY FUND the sum of \$4,505.00 (if revenues from sources other than taxes are to be deposited in the Safety, Service, etc., Funds as heretofore, an Ordinance to this effect must be passed by Council, Sec. 5625-11 G.C.); and that there be appropriated from said SAFETY FUND the following:

B. SAFETY FUND

Table with 2 columns: Item description and Amount. Items include Marshal (\$100.00), Police (3,400.00), Station House, Other Police Expenses (405.00), Fire Chief - Salary, Firemen, Fire Apparatus, Fire Stations, Other Fire Department Expenses (600.00), and Hospitals and Pest Houses. Total Safety Fund: \$4,505.00

Section 5. That there be transferred from the GENERAL FUND to the SERVICE FUND the sum of \$2,550.00; and that there be appropriated from said SERVICE FUND the following:

Section 20. And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon appeal of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and

for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 21. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2 - 1952

GIVING CONSENT OF THE VILLAGE TO THE PLOWING OF SNOW AND USE  
OF ABRASIVES FOR ICE CONTROL UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE  
DIRECTOR OF HIGHWAYS, STATE OF OHIO

WHEREAS, The Director of Highways is considering the matter of the plowing of snow and the placing of abrasives for ice control, under his supervision, from all State Highways Extensions in or through incorporated villages, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1178-5 of the General Code of Ohio, and,

WHEREAS, It is proposed to plow the snow and place abrasives for ice control on all State Highway Extensions within the Village of Centerville, in accordance with the standard practices of the Ohio State Highway Department, and,

WHEREAS, Such standard practices of the Ohio State Highway Department in the plowing of snow consists only of the plowing of snow from the travelled way and does not include the removal of snow from driveways, parking areas, and intersecting roads or streets, and,

WHEREAS, It is understood that this Ordinance does not in any way obligate the State of Ohio, and will in no manner detract from the responsibility of the village, and said State of Ohio being saved harmless from any and all claims of any nature arising from or growing out of such operations aforesaid,

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: That it is declared to be in the public interest that the consent of said village be, and such consent is hereby given, that said plowing of snow and placing of abrasives for ice control may be done under the supervision of the Director of Highways, and in accordance with the standard practices of the Ohio Department of Highways.

SECTION 2: That the Clerk be, and he hereby is, directed to furnish to the Director of Highways and to the Board of County Commissioners of Montgomery County, Ohio, a certified copy of this Ordinance immediately upon the taking effect thereof.

SECTION 3: That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
