Section 1. Section 20. And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board of officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon approval of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 21. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

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ORDINANCE NO. 4 - 1947

-I- It shall be unlawful for any person, while in an intoxicated condition, to operate or drive any automobile, motorcycle, motor truck, or other motor vehicle upon the streets, alleys or other public highways or public places of the Village of Centerville, Ohio.

-II- Whoever violates any of the provisions of paragraph I of this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

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ORDINANCE NO. 5 - 1947

DETERMINING TO PROCEED WITH THE IMPROVEMENT OF WELLER AVENUE FROM MAIN STREET TO EAST AVENUE,

Be It Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring:

Section I. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Weller Avenue from Main Street to East Avenue by grading and resurfacing the same and in connection with said improvement, to construct curbs and gutters on part of said street, in accordance with Resolution No. 3, passed July 14, 1947, and in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles heretofore approved and now on file in the Office of the Clerk of said Village.

Section II. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom if any shall be judicially inquired into after the completion of the proposed improvement.

Section III. That the whole cost of said improvement and the costs and expense of proceedings hereunder shall be paid out of the Street Maintenance Fund of said Village except that the cost of curbs and gutters shall be assessed at a rate not to exceed seventy cents (70¢) per front foot upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specifically benefitted by said improvement. The balance of the costs of said curbs and gutters, if any, shall be paid by the Village of Centerville out of its General Fund. The assessments so to be levied for curbs and gutters shall be paid in one annual installment, provided that the owner of any property assessed may have his option to pay such assessment in cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessing ordinance.
