

ORDINANCE NO. 6 - 1945

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES IN THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and State of Ohio, three-fourths of the members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. All motor driven vehicles parked on the public streets of Centerville must park parallel to the curb. Those vehicles headed in a northerly direction must park on the east side of the street; those vehicles headed in a southerly direction must park on the west side of the street; those vehicles headed in an easterly direction must park on the south side of the street; and those vehicles headed in a westerly direction must park on the north side of the street.

Section 2. For the safety of persons and property, all street signs, traffic light and other notices must be strictly obeyed.

Section 3. Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined Five Dollars (\$5.00) or such lesser amount as shall be fixed by the Court.

ORDINANCE NO. 1 - 1946

ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE
(Village)

An Ordinance to make Appropriations for Current Expenses and other Expenditures of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1946.

Section 1. Be It Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, That, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the said Village of Centerville during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1946, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows, viz:

Section 20. And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board of officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon approval of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 21. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

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ORDINANCE NO. 2 - 1946

(Section 1178-42, Ohio General Code)

GRANTING DIRECTOR OF HIGHWAYS AUTHORITY TO MAINTAIN
CENTERLINES ON STATE HIGHWAYS INSIDE VILLAGE CORPORATION.

WHEREAS, The Director of Highways, under Sec. 1178-42 of the General Code of Ohio, is authorized to centerline paint extensions of State Highways within the limits of a village, and

WHEREAS, Extensions of State Highways No. 48 and 725 lie within this village, and

WHEREAS, This ordinance shall in no manner relieve or discharge the said village from any claim or claims of any nature arising from, or growing out of, the maintenance by the Department of Highways of the State of Ohio of said highways in said village, and the said village shall save the State of Ohio harmless from any and all such claims,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: It is hereby declared to be in the public interest that the consent of said village be, and said consent hereby is, given to the Department of Highways of the State of Ohio for said Department to centerline paint the State Highways within said village as hereinbefore set out.

SECTION 2: That the Clerk be, and he hereby is, directed to furnish to the Director of Highways and to the Board of County Commissioners of Montgomery County, Ohio, a certified copy of this Ordinance immediately upon the taking effect thereof.

SECTION 3: That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
