

ORDINANCE NO. 1 - 1939

ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE
(VILLAGE)

An Ordinance to make Appropriations for Current Expenses and other Expenditures of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1939.

Sec. 1. Be It Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, That, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the said Village of Centerville during the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1939, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows, vix:

That there be transferred from the GENERAL FUND to the GENERAL BOND RETIREMENT FUND the sum of \$388.31; and further that there be transferred from the WATER FUND to the GENERAL BOND RETIREMENT FUND the sum of \$1739.00; and that there be appropriated from said GENERAL BOND RETIREMENT FUND the following:

Sec. 6. And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw her warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board of officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon approval of two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

Sec. 7. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2 - 1939

To create a City Planning Commission for the Village of Centerville, Montgomery County, Ohio.

Be It Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, Montgomery County, State of Ohio:

Sec. 1. That a City Planning Commission of five (5) members be, and the same hereby is, created.

Sec. 2. That said Commission shall have such powers and perform such functions as are conferred upon it by law and as shall be conferred upon it from time to time by ordinance.

Sec. 3. That said Commission shall consist of the Mayor, one member of council to be selected by the council for the remainder of his term as a member of council, and three citizens of the municipality to be appointed by the Mayor by and with the consent of the council for terms of six years each, except in the first instance, the terms of all members of said Commission shall expire on the first day of January, 1940. At the first regular meeting of council in January of 1940, the Mayor shall appoint the three citizen-members of the Commission, one for a term of two years, one
