ORDINANCE NO. 2 - 1939

To create a City Planning Commission for the Village of Centerville, Montgomery County, Ohio.

Be It Ordained by the Council of the Village of Centerville, Montgomery County, State of Ohio:

Sec. 1. That a City Planning Commission of five (5) members be, and the same hereby is, created.

Sec. 2. That said Commission shall have such powers and perform such functions as are conferred upon it by law and as shall be conferred upon it from time to time by ordinance.

Sec. 3. That said Commission shall consist of the Mayor, one member of council to be selected by the council for the remainder of his term as a member of council, and three citizens of the municipality to be appointed by the Mayor by and with the consent of the council for terms of six years each, except in the first instance, the terms of all members of said Commission shall expire on the first day of January, 1940. At the first regular meeting of council in January of 1940, the Mayor shall appoint the three citizen-members of the Commission, one for a term of two years, one

for a term of four years and one for a term of six years.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from an after the earliest period allowed by law.
