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ORDINANCE NO. 24 - 1939

SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE YEAR 1939.

An Ordinance to make supplemental appropriations for current expenses and other expenditures of the Village of Centerville, Montgomery County, Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31, 1939.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Centerville, Montgomery County, Ohio, three-fourths of the members elected thereto concurring, that to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of said Village of Centerville during the fiscal year ending December 31, 1939, the following sums be, and they hereby are, set aside and appropriated as follows:

Sec. 1. That there be appropriated from the General Fund:

A. General Fund

A 8 Bond Retirement Fund (General) \$422.70

Sec. 2. That there be transferred from the General Fund to the General Bond Retirement Fund the sum of \$422.70.

Sec. 3. And the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to draw her warrants on the Village Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the board or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon approval of two-thirds vote of council for items or expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by the other specific appropriations herein made.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

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ORDINANCE NO. 26 - 1939

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF 0.26 ACRES OF LAND LOCATED IN THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO, BEING PART OF A 0.51 ACRE TRACT DESCRIBED IN DEED BOOK 818, PAGE 291 OF THE DEED RECORDS OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO, NOT NEEDED FOR ANY MUNICIPAL PURPOSE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and State of Ohio, three-fourths of the members elected thereto concurring:

That the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs be and it hereby is authorized to sell said real estate to the highest bidder according to law, upon the following terms: cash in hand, and the said Board of Trustees of Public Affairs and the Mayor of the village are hereby authorized to convey said real estate by deed to the highest bidder therefor according to law.
