

## RECORD OF ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 55

An Ordinance regulating speed limits within the Village of Centerville, Ohio and to define business or closely built up portions of said Village.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE? STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That no person shall operate a motor vehicle in and upon the public roads and highways of said Village at a speed greater or less than is reasonable and proper having due regard to the traffic, surface and width of the road or highway and of any other conditions then existing, and no person shall drive any motor vehicle in and upon any public road or highway in said Village at a greater speed than will permit him to bring it to a stop within the assured clear distance ahead.

Section 2. It shall be prima facie lawful for the operator of a motor vehicle in said Village to drive the same at a speed not to exceed the following:

Twenty (20) miles per hour when passing a school building or the grounds thereof during school recess and while children are going to or leaving school during the opening or closing hours.

Twenty (20) miles per hour in the business or closely built up portions of said Village.

Said business or closely built up portions of said Village are defined as follows:

Main Street from the South line of Martha Avenue North to the North line of Cemetery Drive.  
Franklin Street from the West line of the Township School House East to the East line of East Drive.

Twenty-five miles per hour in all other portions of said village except on State Routes and Main Thoroughfares.

Thirty-five miles per hour on State Routes or Main Thoroughfares within said Village but outside of the above defined business portions.

Section 3. Any person found guilty of violating any section of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars and shall pay for the costs of prosecution.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure by reason of the fact that it is necessary to immediately provide said Village with Traffic Regulation and same is necessary for the welfare and safety of the citizens of said village and for this reason this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
