

## RECORD OF ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 54

Regulating the price of electricity for the lighting of traffic signals and authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract for such lighting.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE:

Section 1. That during the period of one year from and after the passage of this ordinance and its acceptance by The Dayton Power and Light Co., and from year to year thereafter, until terminated by either party in writing to the other, said Company may charge for operation of traffic signals to be described in the contract which will be entered into by the Village of Centerville and said Company, the following price to-wit:

Each four way traffic signal consisting of twelve 50 watt lamps, not more than four of which shall be burning at one time, and to be in operation for not more than eighteen hours per day-- seventy-two (\$72.00) dollars per signal per year.

Section 2. Said, The Dayton Power and Light Company shall in no event during the period designated, aforesaid charge for the operation of the said traffic signals more than the price herein specified.

Section 3. That the Mayor be and he hereby is authorized to enter into a contract on behalf of the Village of Centerville with The Dayton Power and Light Company providing for such operation of traffic signals at the price herein set forth, which contract is on file with the village clerk and the form of which is hereby approved.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date allowed by law and shall, when accepted by The Dayton Power and Light Company, constitute a contract between The Village of Centerville and said Company.
