

RECORD OF ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 39TO Regulate and control lights and Motor Vehicles.BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED Village
OF Centerville Montgomery County OHIO, THAT

sec(1) That whoever, being the driver of any motor vehicle upon the streets and alleys of said village in the night season, fail upon the approach of another vehicle, to control the headlights by dimming, or otherwise on such motor vehicle, so that at a distance of not less than to hundred feet in front of such vehicle no part of the intensified rays shall be visible more than $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet above the surface of the highway and remain so until the approaching vehicle passed by, shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than twenty five dollars for the first offense, and not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each subsequent offense.

sec(2) The provisions of this section shall not exempt motor vehicles equipped with approved non Glare Glasses defined in Sec, 6310-1 of the General Code.

In addition to the provisions covering the dimming of headlights it is compulsory that all motorists must use on their machines two headlights and one tail light. Any person or persons violating sec, 2 of this ordinance, upon conviction, shall be fined any sum from five dollars to twenty five dollars and costs of prosecution, and if said fine and costs are not paid may be confined in the County Jail until said fine and costs are paid or otherwise discharged according to law.

This ordinance shall be in forced and take effect in 15 days after its passage.
