

RECORD OF ORDINANCES

Ordinance No. 45

TO Further regulate Vehicle and Automobile Traffic.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED Village
OF Centerville Montgomery County OHIO, THAT

That the Dayton and Lebanon Pike shall be known and considered as the Main Highway north and South in said Village.

That all persons before entering upon said Main Highway running North and South coming from the East or West shall come to a full stop at a point indicated by the word "Stop" as shown in and on the streets East and West of said Main Highway.

It is provided drivers of all vehicles traveling on the Main Highway shall have the right of way over all vehicles traveling from the East and West.

No vehicle or automobile shall stop or park in any direction other than which it should travel on the proper side of the street.

No vehicle shall park within forty feet of the curb lines facing any street within the limits of said village or of the two main thoroughfares and no vehicle or automobile shall be operated running backward around any of the main corners in said village.

All cars must park in a diagonal position and in the direction in which they should travel.

Automobiles approaching gasoline stations may approach the same in the most convenient and least dangerous manner but shall at all times obey the law and ordinances in passing the guide post to the right before turning the left. No car shall remain at a filling station after service is rendered.

No car shall be allowed to park or stand to the rear of a car or cars already parked or stand two or more abreast.

Any person or persons violating any section or sections of this ordinance upon conviction shall be fined in any sum from one to twenty five dollars. If said fine and costs are not paid said parties may be confined in the County Jail until said fine and costs are paid or caused to be paid or otherwise discharged according to law.

This ordinance shall be in force and effect in thirty days after its passage.
