

RECORD OF ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 48TO Fix the price of electricity supplied for electric lights.BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED Village
OF Centerville Montgomery County OHIO, THAT

Section 1. That for a period of ten years from June 1, 1927, The Dayton Power and Light Company may charge for electricity supplied for lighting purposes to any and all persons, firms, companies, or corporations of the Village of Centerville, Ohio, twelve cents (12 cts.) per thousand wathours, subject, however, to a discount of one cent per one thousand wathours for prompt payment on or before the 5th day after the bill for the same is rendered.

The foregoing price shall include the use of meters. All meters shall be furnished by the Company and there shall be no charge made for setting or re-setting the same, but the company shall be entitled to make and collect a minimim charge of \$1.00 per month as a readiness-to-serve charge for each electric light meter installed by it, provided that any consumer desiring temporarily to abandon the use of electricity for one month or more may give the company written notice, mailed to its Main Office, Dayton, Ohio, to remove such meter, and after the giving of such notice such readiness-to-serve charge shall be discontinued until such meter is reset in said premises.

All bills for electricity shall be payable at a place in Centerville to be from time to time designated by the company.

During said period of ten years said company shall not charge more for any electricity supplied for lighting purposes by it than the prices stated herein.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, provided, that said company shall file a written acceptance of the same with the clerk of the Village within forty days after the date of its passage.
