

RECORD OF ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 50

MR. L. E. Bradford Mayor INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF THE COUNCIL:

An ordinance TO PROVIDE FOR THE SALE OF REAL ESTATE BELONGING TO THE VILLAGE OF CENTERVILLE, OHIO, AND NOT NEEDED FOR ANY MUNICIPAL PURPOSE.

Whereas, the Village of Centerville in Montgomery County, Ohio, owns the following described real estate, to-wit:

"Situate in the Town of Centerville, County of Montgomery and State of Ohio, being the south half of lot number twenty eight (28) on Benjamin Robbins Plat of an addition of said Town of Centerville."

And Whereas, said real estate is not needed for any municipal purpose; now therefore.

Be it Ordained, by the Council of the Village of Centerille, in Montgomery County, State of Ohio;

That said above described real estate be sold at public sale by auction on the premises on the first day of Sept., A. D., 1928, at Two o'clock, P. M., to the highest bidder therefor for cash payable as follows: Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars on day of sale and balance of said purchas price in cash upon delivery of deed;

And that said sale be advertised once a week for give consecutive weeks before said sale in Dayton Herald, a newspaper of general circulation within said corporation;

And that this ordinance shall be and become in force at the earliest time provided by law therefor.

Mr. Walter Woods moved that the rule of reading the forgoing ordinance fully and distinctly on three different days be dispensed with, said motion was seconded by Mr. Kenrick and a vote was taken thereon by ayes and nays with the following result:
