Ordinance No. 33

TO Regulate Pool and Billard Rooms and Tables.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED Village OF Centerville Montgomery County OHIO, THAT

- sec() It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons, firm, or cor poration to maintain and operate a pool or billard room, or keep, or operate a pool or billiard table at any other public place within the corporation limits of the Village of Centerville Montgomery County, Ohio without first obtaining a licinse from the Mayor of seld Villege as provided herein.
- sec(2) That the Mayor of said Village is hereby authorised to issue a license for the purpose mentioned in section one, upon the payment of seventy five dollars per year for the first table so used, and an additional twenty five dollars for each additional table so used.
- sec(3) That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation maintaining and operating a pool, or billard room or keeping and operating a poool, or billard table at any other such public to be open, or permit such table to be used upon the first day of the week commonly called Sunday, or before six oclock A. M. or after nine oclock P. M. central standard time upon any other day of the week.
 - sec(4) That it shall be unlawful for any such person, or persons, firm or corporation mentioned in section one to permit a minor under the age of eighteen years to play pool, or billards, or to be and remain in such pool and billard room.
- sec(5) Any person, persons, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than Ten dollars or more than fifty dollars and the costs of prosecution for the first offense, and for a subsequent offense shall be fined not less than twenty five dollars or more than one hundred dollars and the costs of prosecution.
- sec(6) This ordinance shall take effect, and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.
