

RECORD OF ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 36TO Fix the price of Electricity supplied for Electric Light.BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED Village
OF Centerville OHIO, THAT

SEC(1) That for a period of ten years from and after the taking effect of this ordinance, The Dayton Power and Light Company may charge for electricity supplied for lighting purposes to the citizens and private consumers of the said Village, at the following rates; 1. To Premises used for business purposes at the rate of 11¢ per 1000 wathours for the first 30 KW hours per month, and for all over 30 KW hours per month at the rate of 9¢ per 1000 watt hours, both rates to be subject, however, to a discount of 1¢ per 1000 watt hours for prompt payment on or before the fifth day of the month bills to be rendered on the first day of each month. 2. To residences at the rate of 11¢ per 1000 watt hours, subject however, to a discount of 1¢ per 1000 watt hours for prompt payment on or before the fifth day of the month, bills to be rendered on the first day of each month. The foregoing price shall include the use of meters, all meters shall be furnished by the company and there shall be no charge made for setting or resetting the same, but the Company shall be entitled to make a minimum charge of 1.00 dollar per month as a readiness to serve charge for each electric light meter installed by it, provided that any consumer desiring temporarily to abandon the use of electricity for one month or more may give the company written notice, mailed to its main office at Dayton, Ohio, to remove such meter, and after the giving of such notice such readiness to serve charge shall be discontinued until such meter is reset in said premises. All bills for electricity shall be payable at a place in Centerville to be from time designated by the Company.

During said period of ten years said company shall not charge more for any electricity supplied for lighting purposes by it than the prices stated herein.

SEC(2) This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by Law.
