

RECORD OF ORDINANCES.

Ordinance No. 37

TO _____

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED
OF _____ OHIO, THAT

AN Ordinance to advertise for proposals and to contract for the Lighting of streets, public ways and public grounds with electric Light. Be it Ordained by the council of the incorporated Village of Centerville, Ohio.

That the plans and specifications for lighting the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys, and public places of the Village of Centerville, Ohio with electric light, now on file with the Clerk of the Village are hereby approved.

That the Village shall contract for lighting its streets, avenues, lanes, alleys, and public places with electric light in accordance with said plans and specific actions, for the period of ten years from the awarding of the contract, which shall be done as soon as practicable after the bids are received.

That the Clerk of the Village is directed to advertise according to law for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the Village for bids to do said lighting, which shall be received by the Clerk and be opened at 12 oclock noon on the last day for filing them and be publicly read by him at the Council Chamber of the Village.

That all bids shall be on the blank forms prepared by the Village and to be had from the Clerk of the Village upon application to him, and each bid shall be accompanied by a certified check upon a solvent bank, payable to said Clerk, in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars as a guarantee that if awarded the contract the bidder will enter into a proper contract with the Village to do said lighting and will give a sufficient undertaking for its performance. The checks of unsuccessful bidders shall be returned to them as soon as the successful bidder is ascertained, and the check of the successful bidder shall be returned as soon as the said contract and undertaking are executed.

That a contract in accordance here with shall be made between the Village and the lowest and best bidder to do said lighting, and a sufficient undertaking, to the satisfaction of Council, for the performance of the contract shall be given said Village.

That the Ordinance shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by Law.
