

RECORD OF ORDINANCES.

(Revised) Ordinance No. 1

TO Prevent, and Punish Crime

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE INCORPORATED Village
OF Centerville Montgomery County OHIO, THAT

Beit Ordained by the Council of the incorporated village of Centerville Montgomery County and State of Ohio, that it shall be unlawful for the proprietor, or keeper of any Grocery, Restaurent, Soloon, Barroom, Confectionary, or any other establishment whatsoever, sec(1) to keep the same open on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday within the limits of said village, for the purpose of selling bartering or in any way disposing of either by retail or wholesale, Wine, Cider, Ale, Beer Porter or any Spirituoual Liquors of any kind, Soda Water, Lemonade, Confectionary or Pastry of any kind, And Shall be unlawful for any person or persons to sell, or barter, or caused to be sold, or bartered, on said day within the limits of said village, Cigars, Chewing or Smoking Tobacco, provided that nothing here in contained shall be construed to apply to any person regularly, and lawfully engaged, in the selling of Drugs so as to prohibit such persons from selling on said day, Wine, and Spirituous Liquors for medical purposes only.

All violators of section one of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding thirty dollars nor less than five dollars and costs of prosecution, and be confined in sec(2) the County Jail untill said fine and costz are paid ordered to be paid or discharged according to law.
