Bradstreet presiding. Present: Messrs. J. Mason McClure, Robert H. Fox, Grafton E. Shawen, Wendell W. Lawson and Robert J. Schweizer.

The minutes of the meeting held April 9, 1945 were read and approved.

It was moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Schweizer and carried that the following bills be approved for payment.

Thereupon, Mr. McClure introduced Ordinance No. 3-1945, being?" AN Ordinance regulating the ownership, possession or control of any animal or fowl in the Village of Centerville, Montgomery County, Ohio and declared an emergency," which was given its first reading.

A roll call was ordered which resulted in Five "eyes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Shawen,

Lawson, Fox, Schweizer and McClure .

Said Ordinance NO.3-1945 was given its second and third readings.

The question being, shall said Ordinance No. 3-1945 be passed? It was moved by Mr. Schweizer, seconded by Mr. Fox and carried that said Ordinance No. 3-1945 be passed. A roll call was ordered which resulted in five "Ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Schweizer, Fox, Shawen, Lawson, and McClure.

A discussion concerning the drainage of East Drive followed with the visitors Mr. Knauer (San. Engr.), Mr. Woolpert (Civil Engr.) and Mr. Jeffery (Atty.) taking part. The Council agreed that Mr. Jeffery be selected to act as Village Solicitor for the remainder of the year at \$200. per year.

It was moved by Mr. Lawson, seconded by Mr. McClure and carried that the meeting adjourn.
