MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio, met in regular session on Wednesday, July 25, 1945, in the Council Chamber with Mayor Emory W. Bradstreet presiding. Present: Messrs. J. Mason McClure, W.W. Lawson, Grafton E. Shawen, Robert H. Fox, and Robert J. Schweizer.

The minutes of the meeting held July 9, 1945 were read and approved.

It was moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Lawson and carried that the following bills be allowed for payment.

Thereupon, Mr. McClure introduced Ordinance No. 5-1945, being, "An Ordinance fixing the salaries of Village Officers employed by the Village of Centerville," which was given its

Mr. Schweizer then made the following motion: "I move that the statutory rule requiring Ordinance and Resolutions to be read on three separate and distinct days be dispensed with so that Ordinance No. 5- 1945 may be given its second and third reading," seconded by Mr. Lawson and carried. A roll call was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Schweizer, Lawson, Fox, Shawen and McClure.

Said Ordinance NO. 5- 1945 was given its second and third readings.

The question being, shall said Ordinance No. 5, 1945 be passed? It was moved by Mr. Lawson, seconded by Mr. Shawen and carried that said Ordinance NO. 5-1945 be passed. A roll call was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Lawson, Shawen, Fox, Schweizer and McClure.

It was moved by Mr. Schweizer, seconded by Mr. McClure and carried that the Winters National Bank act as the Village of Centervilles Depository until August 22, 1947. A roll call was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Schweizer, McClure, Fox, Shawen and Lawson.

It was moved by Mr. Lawson, seconded by Mr. Shawen and carried that the meeting adjourn.
