

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL

The Council of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio, met in regular session on Monday evening, January 10, 1944 at 8:00 o'clock in the Council Chamber. Present: Messrs. J. Mason McClure, Grafton E. Shawen, Wendell W. Lawson, Robert H. Fox and Robert J. Schweizer with Mayor Emory W. Bradstreet presiding. Mr. Daniel C. McCoy was absent.

The minutes of the meeting held January 3, 1944 for the purpose of adjourning sine die were read and approved. Likewise the minutes of the meeting January 3, 1944 for the purpose of organization of the <sup>new</sup> Council were read and approved.

Mr. Robert J. Schweizer, nominated to fill a vacancy on the Council, was duly sworn according to law by the Mayor, as Councilman of the Village of Centerville.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs collected in Ordinances Cases during the month of December, 1943, showing the sum of \$145. had been paid into the Village Treasury, was submitted. It was moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Schweizer and carried, that said report be accepted and placed on file as of December 31, 1943. A roll call was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. McClure, Schweizer, Shawen, Fox, and Lawson.

The Mayor appointed Mr. Paul Will as Marshal of the Village of Centerville for a term of two years, the term ending December 31, 1945.

A motion was made by Mr. Lawson that the Mayor's appointment of Mr. Paul Will as Village Marshal for a period of two years, be accepted. Mr. Shawen seconded the motion. A roll call was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Lawson, Shawen, McClure, Fox, and Schweizer.

After a discussion of the Marshal's salary, in his presence and to his satisfaction, a motion was made by Mr.

Schweizer that, "A resolution be drawn to employ the Marshal of the Village of Centerville at a salary of \$100. per month, for the first quarter of 1944". The motion was seconded by Mr. Lawson. A roll call was ordered which resulted in five "eyes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Schweizer, Lawson, Shawen, Fox and McClure.

A discussion followed to see what could be done in the near future for the drainage of East Drive.

Mr. Will, was advised by the Council to make an investigation concerning the cost of installation and monthly charge of a telephone in the Mayor's Office.

It was moved by Mr. McClure, seconded by Mr. Fox and carried, that the meeting adjourn.
