

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL

The Council of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery, and State of Ohio, met in regular session on Monday evening, January 11, 1943, at 7:30 o'clock in the Council Chamber.

Present at roll call were Messrs. Walter H. Woods, Thomas J. Davis, Grafton E. Shawen, Robert J. Schweizer, Daniel C. McCoy, and George E. Howe, with Mayor Emory W. Bradstreet presiding.

The minutes of the meeting held December 30, 1942 were read and approved.

A motion was then made by Mr. McCoy and seconded by Mr. Woods and carried that the following bills be approved and ordered paid:

Safety Fund:

To B. W. Himes for labor and supplies Voucher #1 \$11.50

Street Maintenance (Motor Vehicle License)

To C. W. Whitaker, for 4 yds, sand Voucher #2 2.00
\$13.50

A roll call was ordered which resulted in six "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. McCoy, Woods, Davis, Shawen, Schweizer, and Howe.

Ordinance No. 1-1943, being "An Ordinance regulating the standing, or parking of vehicles upon the streets and alleys in the village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and State of Ohio," was sponsored by Mr. McCoy and given its first reading. Mr. Woods then submitted the following motion. "I move that the statutory rule requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three separate and distinct days be dispense with so that Ordinance #1-1943 may be given its second and third reading." Said motion was seconded by Mr. Howe. Ordinance #1-1943 was then given its second and third readings. The question being shall Ordinance #1-1943 be passed. A motion that Ordinance #1-1943 be passed was then made by Mr. McCoy seconded by Mr. Davis and carried.

A roll call was ordered which resulted in six "Ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. McCoy, Davis, Woods, Shawen, Schweizer, and Howe.

A motion that the meeting adjourn was then made by Mr. Schweizer seconded by Mr. McCoy and unaminously carried.
