## Minutes of Regular Meeting of Council.

The Council of The Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio, met in regular session on Monday Feb. 15, 1943, in the Council Chamber.

Present were: Walter Woods, Grafton Shawen, Robt. Schweizer, Geo. Howe, Dan. McCoy, Mayor Emory Bradsteet presiding.

The minutes of Jan. 11, were read and Approved.

The Mayor then submitted his report of fines, forfeitures and costs collected on Ordinance cases from Jan. 1, 1943 to Jan. 31, 1943. showing that \$40.00 was paid into the Municipal treasury. It was moved by Mr. Schweizer that said report be filed, seconded by Mr. Shawen, carried.

Resolution #1\_\_1943 being a resolution accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the budget commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor, was sponsored by Mr. Schweizer and given its first reading. Mr McCoy then made the following motion: that the statutory rule requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three separate days be dispensed with, so that the foregoing resolution may be given its second and third readings at once. This motion was seconded by Mr. Howe and carried unanimously. Resolution 1--1943 was then given its second and third readings. A motion made by Mr. McCoy, seconded by Mr. Woods that Resolution 1--1943 be passed carried by a unanimous vote.

Thereupon Mr. Woods introduced Ordinance #2--1943, being an ordinance to make partial appropriation for current expences and other expenditures for the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending Dec, 31, 1943, and it was given its first reading.

Mr. Schweizer made the following motion; that the statutory rule requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three separate days be dispensed with so that Ordinance #2--1943 may be given its second and third readings immediately. Mr. McCoy seconded this motion and it carried unanimously. Ordinance #2--1943 was then given its second and third readings. Mr. McCoy moved that ordinance #2--1943 be passed.

Mr. Shawen seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

It was moved by Mr. Schweizer, seconded by Mr. Howe, and carried that the following bills be approved and paid:
