MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL

The Council of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery, and State of Ohio, met in regular session on Wednesday night, December 30, 1942 in the Council Chamber.

Present: Walter H. Woods, Thomas J. Davis, Grafton E. Shawen, Robert J. Schweizer and George E. Howe, with Mayor Emory W. Bradstreet presiding. Mr. Daniel C. McCoy was absent.

The minutes of the regular meeting held December 14, 1942 were read and approved.

The Mayor then submitted his report of fines, forfeitures and costs collected in Ordinance cases from December 1, 1942 to December 30, 1942 inclusive, showing that \$48.75 was paid into the municipal treasury. It was moved by Mr. Schwizer, seconded by Mr. Howe and carried that said report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Schweizer, Howe, Woods, Davis, and Shawen.

Ordinance #4-1942, Being an Ordinance Authorizing Blackout and Air Raid Protection Orders, Rules and Regulations; Prescribing Penalties for Violation there of; and Declaring an Emergency", was sponsored by Mr. Schweizer and given its first reading.

Mr. Woods then submitted the following motion: "I move that the statutory rule requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three separate and distinct days be dispense with so that Ordinance #4-1942 may be given its second and third readings." Said motion was seconded by Mr. Shawen. A call of votes was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Woods, Shawen, Davis, Schweizer, and Howe.

The question being shall Ordinance #4-1942 pass, a motion that said Ordinance be passed was made by Mr. Howe, seconded by Mr. Davis and carried. A roll call was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Howe, Davis, Woods, Shawen, and Schweizer.

Ordinance #5-1942, being "An Ordinance to make supplemental appropriations for current expense and other expenditures of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and State of Ohio during the fiscal year ending December 31, 1942," was sponsored by Mr. Howe and given its first reading.

Mr. Schweizer then submitted the following motion: "I move that the statutory rules requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three separate and distinct days be dispensed with so that Ordinance #5-1942 may be given its second and third readings." Said motion was seconded by Mr. Woods and carried. A call of votes was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Schweizer, Woods, Davis, Shawen and Howe.

The question being shall Ordinance #5-1942 be passed. A motion that Ordinance #5-1942 be passed was made by Mr. Davis, seconded by Mr. Shawen and carried. A call of votes was ordered which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Davis, Shawen, Woods, Schweizer and Howe.

A motion that council adjourn was then made by Mr. Shawen, seconded by Mr. Schweizer, and carried.
