MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL.

The Council of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and State of Ohio, met in regular session on Monday evening, October 14, 1940 at 7:30 o'clock in the Council Chamber.

Present: Messrs. Walter H. Woods, Joseph S. Lucas, Grafton E. Shawen and Franklin Zimmerman, with Mayor Emory W. Bradstreet presiding. Mr. Thomas J. Davis was absent on account of being in the hospital. Mr. Lloyd Hibberd was also absent.

Messrs. Weidner, Gebhart and Miller, Trustees of Washington Township, were also present. Mr. E. J. Tingle, a resident on Ridgeway Road, was also present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of September 23, 1940 were read and approved.

The mayor submitted his report dated October 4, 1940 of fines, forfeitures and costs collected in ordinance cases from September 1 to 30, 1940 both inclusive, (Criminal Cash Book No. 1, page 6), and showing that \$39.00 was paid into the municipal treasury.
