The question being shall said Ordinance No. 1 - 1940 pass? Mr. Woods thereupon moved that said Ordinance No. 1 - 1940 be passed, which was seconded by Mr. Davis and unanimously carried. A roll call was ordered, which resulted in six "ayes" being cast in favor of the passage of the ordinance. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Woods, Davis, Lucas, Shawen, Hibberd and Zimmerman.

It was then moved by Mr. Hibberd, seconded by Mr. Lucas, and unanimously carried that the meeting adjourn.

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL.

The Council of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and State of Ohio, met in regular session on Monday evening, January 22, 1940, at 7:30 o'clock in the Council Chamber.

Present: Messrs. Joseph S. Lucas, Grafton E. Shawen, Lloyd Hibberd and Franklin Zimmerman. Mr. Walter H. Woods was absent on account of illness and Mr. Thomas J. Davis on account of being out of the city. Mayor Emory W. Bradstreet presided.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Thereupon Mr. Lucas introduced Ordinance No. 2 - 1940, being "An Ordinance to make Appropriations for Current Expenses and other Expenditures of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31, 1940", which was given its first reading.

Thereupon Mr. Shawen introduced Ordinance No. 3 - 1940, being "An Ordinance regulating traffic upon the public streets of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and State of Ohio, and repealing all other ordinances and sections of ordinances in conflict herewith", which was given its first reading.

Thereupon Mr. Hibberd introduced Ordinance No. 4 - 1940, being "An Ordinance fixing the price which The Dayton Power and Light Company may charge for electric light furnished to the public grounds, streets, lanes, alleys and avenues in the Village of Centerville, Ohio, for a period of Five (5) Years, commencing on the 28th day of December, 1939, and determining the manner in which said lighting may be furnished, provided and paid for", which was given its first reading.

It was moved by Mr. Hibberd and seconded by Mr. Zimmerman that this meeting adjourn to meet Tuesday evening, January 23, 1940, at 6:45 o'clock in the Council Chamber. A roll call was ordered, which resulted in four "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Lucas, Shawen, Hibberd and Zimmerman.
