The Council of the Village of Centerville, in the County

Trustees of Public Affairs, Mr. Robert Fox, operator of the Water
Works, Mr. Leo Wall, Village Engineer, and Mr. Williams, of the
Bowser-Morner Laboratories, Inc., were also present.

The minutes of the regular meeting held May 13, 1940 and
of the special meeting held May 20, 1940 were read and approved.

Thereupon a full report was made to Council of the steps
being taken to correct the taste of our water, after which a general
discussion ensued.

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL.

The Council of the Village of Centerville, in the County of Montgomery and State of Ohio, met in regular session on Monday evening, June 10, 1940 at 7:30 o'clock in the Council Chamber.

Present: Messrs. Walter H. Woods, Thomas J. Davis, Joseph S. Lucas, Grafton E. Shawen and Franklin Zimmerman with Mayor Emory W. Bradstreet presiding. Mr. Lloyd Hibberd was absent.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 27, 1940 were read and approved.

The Mayor submitted his report, dated June 4, 1940, of fines, forfeitures and costs collected in ordinance cases from May 1 to 31, 1940, both inclusive, (Criminal Cash Book No. 1, page 4), and showing that \$240 was paid into the municipal treasury. It was moved by Mr. Lucas, seconded by Mr. Woods, and unanimously carried that said report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call was ordered, which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting in the affirmative were Messrs. Woods, Davis, Lucas, Shawen and Zimmerman.

Thereupon Mr. Woods introduced Ordinance No. 7 - 1940, being an "Ordinance forbidding the shooting of guns or pistols within the corporate limits of the Village of Centerville, and declaring an emergency", which was given its first reading.

Mr. Zimmerman then made the following motion: "I move that the statutory rule requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three separate and distinct days, be dispensed with, so that the foregoing Ordinance No. 7 - 1940 may be given its second and third readings." Said motion was seconded by Mr. Shawen and unanimously carried. A roll call was ordered, which resulted in five "ayes" being cast in favor of the motion. Those voting
