

Regular Meeting

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in regular session August 5, 1957 with mayor Jackson presiding. Present: Kenneth Poff, Gilbert Neubauer, Robert Billett, James Presbaugh, William Dutcher and Frank Arnold. Others included Mr. Lynn, Mr. Wall, Mr. & Mrs. Anderson^{YCS's}, Mr. Riddle, Mr. McClain, Mr. Kennedy, Mr. Frizzell and Mr. Wright.

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved. It was moved by Mr. Neubauer, seconded by Mr. Billett and carried that the minutes be approved. A roll call resulted in 6 eyes in favor of the motion.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs amounting to \$428., State Court cases amounting to \$250.25, and Building permits amounting to \$42., showing that the same had been paid in the Village treasury was submitted.

It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried that the report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 eyes in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Mr. Poff, seconded by Mr. Billett that Resolution 5-1957, "stating that the Winters National Bank and Trust Co. act as a Depository to the Village of Centerville, at a maximum of \$25,000." be passed. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 eyes in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Mr. Poff, seconded by Mr. Billett and carried that the following bills be approved for payment. Mr. Dutcher disqualified himself on voting because he did not hear all of the bills discussed and read.

Mr. Noel Wright gave a concise description of Civil defense and its duties to the community. He expressed that continuity is an important factor in governments especially in preserving records. Councils should support civil defense and fire depts. and educate the people the plans in case of a disaster, as to evacuation and the storage of supplies. The Expense incurred was for delegates, booth at the carnival and signs which may be used again at a public function. He stated that any future Civil Defense expense would be for Delegates and Literature, approximately from \$35 to \$50.

Mr. McClain from the newly annexed territory south of Centerville asked the Council's support in the following.

1. To have the water line covered along their property boundary line.
2. To eliminate dust on the road ways.
3. To have weeds mowed along Spring Valley Road.
4. To check speeders on Spring Valley.

Mr. Wall then gave his report covering the following items

1. The Stripeing of the State Highway will be done as before.
2. S.E. part ~~of~~ ^{from} Village, approximately ¼ section A petition having 100% signatures for annexation. A poll by Council showed a majority in favor of the petition.
3. Annexation of a N.W. section including the Grant Estate. Any expense to be borne by the people of the area. A council poll showed a majority in favor of the petition.
4. To bring the Zoning map up-to-date. It was moved by Mr. Arnold, seconded by Mr. Presbaugh and carried unanimously

to postpone work on the Zoning map until the annexation petitions have been properly acted upon by the Council.

It was moved by Mr. Neubauer, seconded by Mr. Presbaugh and carried that Mr. Lynn be instructed to collect a \$500. Bond from the Summitt Fidelity Surety Co. , Akron, Ohio.

The question of policing the Stone Quarry was discussed. Mr. Lynn is to find out if the Dayton Power & Light and Mr. Schlafman would object to a gate barricade. If not, possibly the Dayton Power & Light would do it.

It was moved by Mr. Billett, seconded by Mr. Neubauer and carried that the digging bond of Mrs, Galloway, amounting to \$100. be forfeited. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

The Council agreed to pay \$620 to the State for material for the burms on the highway from North Corporation line to South Corporation line on Route 48.

The police committee brought up the suggestion of the Marshal using an extra car at 10¢ per mile and gasoline. The consensus of opinion of the Council was "No". The meeting adjourned.

Special Meeting
