

Regular Meeting of Council

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in regular session with Mayor Jackson presiding November 4, 1957. Present: Frank Arnold, James Presbaugh, Robert T. Billett, Kenneth Poff, Gilbert Neubauer, William Dutcher. Engineer Leo Wall, Mr. & Mrs. Andrews, Mr. Cole, Darrell Conley, Patrolman James Smith, Solicitor James Lynn and Mr. Hill.

The Mayor swore in Mr. Albert C. Hill as a member of the Board of appeals.

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved. It was moved by Mr. Neubauer, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried that the minutes be approved as read. A roll call resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs amounting to \$411., State Court cases amounting to \$11., and Building permits ^{sale of Pictures 11.00} amounting to \$294.00, showing that the same had been paid in the Village treasury was submitted. It was moved by Mr. Dutcher, seconded by Mr. Billett and carried that the report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Mr. Billett, seconded by Mr. Neubauer and carried that the following bill be approved for payment.

The Council interviewed Mr. Darrell Conley for employment as Patrolman in the Village of Centerville. Final action is under advisement of Police Committee ~~and~~ Council.

Mr. Wall wished to observe the Village streets with the Street Committee. Saturday November 9, 2 P.M. was the time scheduled for the trip.

Mr. Lynn gave a report of his conference with Mr. Gorman. The Council agreed with Mr. Gorman's desire to have Mr. Wall to draw up a plat map of the section of Street to be dedicated, and to be presented to the Village for record and to be recorded with the County (Hampton Rd. North of intersection of W. Ridgeway)

Mr. Wall's letter of recommendations on Plat 4 was read to the Council. The Council agreed that these recommendations be rectified before the performance bond of Mr. Gorman's be released.

The Mayor read his letter of Oct. 29 to Mr. Ackerman concerning the extension of a 4-lane highway from Kettering through Centerville and stated that letters were sent also by the Citizens League, Mothers Clubs and Lions Club.

The Mayor also reported his meeting with the Co. Commissioners at Farmersville, He and Mr. Wall attended the meeting.

Discussion followed concerning the erection of a ^{Temporary} unit Sewage disposal plant in the proposed Huber Plat. The Construction to be done by the Village under State Specifications, the expense being borne by Mr. Huber.

Mr. Lynn read a letter which he sent to the Federal Works Agency.

A special meeting for Subdividers Rules and Regulations discussion was set for Nov. 13.

The action on West Franklin as requested by the State Dept. was deferred until the first of the year.

It was moved by Mr. Arnold, seconded by Mr. Presbaugh that the Village purchase a 1954 Ford for a reserve Police cruiser for \$950. and the Rca Radio transmitting and Receiving set for \$250. from James R. Smith. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion. Mr. Smith to be paid when the title was ^{Transferred} received.

Then Mr. Dutcher introduced Ord. 8- 57, Being an Ordinance

to amend Ordinance 10-53, being an ordinance to control the excavation into any street, sidewalk, sidewalk space, alley, or public way in connection with the installation of lateral water service pipes, electricity, gas, or drainage lines, conduits, or for any other purpose whatever, and to provide for permits for such digging and excavation,

Mr. Presbaugh moved, "I move the statutory rule for reading Resolutions and Ordinances on three separate and distinct days be dispensed with so Ord. 8-57 may be given its second and third readings" seconded by Mr. Poff and carried. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 eyes in favor of the motion. Ord. 8-57 was given its second and third readings. ~~IXXXX~~

A roll call was ordered which resulted as follows: Mr. Poff, aye; Mr. Billett, aye; Mr. Presbaugh, aye; Mr. Arnold, aye; Mr. Neubauer, aye; Mr. Dutcher, aye.

It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried that the St. Committee be authorized to advertise for bids for a tractor and sickle bar. A roll call resulted in 6 eyes in favor of the motion.

The meeting adjourned.
