Regular meeting of Council

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in regular session, March 14, 1955 with Mayor Kelsey presiding. Present: Don Schell F.C. Lyons, Kenneth Poff, Richard Neal, James Presbaugh, William Dutcher.

Minutes of the previous meeting was read and approved.

Sgt. Hershell D. Pace, 1473 W. 5th Ave., Columbus, O. HU 6-2401 presented to the Council the right, place and money to erect an observation post for the airforce in the Village of Centerville. The cost for the building would be from \$500. to \$850. Action on the matter was tabled.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs amounting to \$30. building permits amounting to \$22. and State Court cases amounting to \$30., showing that the same had been paid in the Village treasury was submitted. It was moved by Mr. Schell, seconded by Mr. Presbaugh and passed unanimously that the report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Burkhart presented a bill amounting to \$129.00 for his services to the Village. It was moved by Mr. Schell, seconded by Mr. Poff that the bill be paid. A roll call was ordered which resulted Schell-aye, Poff-aye, Neal-abstain, Dutcher-abstain, Lyons-no ^{Presbaugh-aye}. Motion was defeated. The Council authorized Mr. Lynn to take the opinion of the State Examiner to the Attorney General to see if the bill can be paid from Village funds.

The bids for the police cruiser was opened and read. The Council approved the bid from C.J. Stueve, Inc. Mr. Presbaugh made the motion to accept the bid from C.J. Stueve, Inc. seconded by Mr. Lyons and carried. A roll call resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion. The bid was \$755 with the old cruiser.

Mr. Hill gave the Council his revised price on writing a zoning Ordinance for the Village of Centerville, being \$580. Mr. Schell ~~XXXXXX~~ introduced Ordinance 5-1955, Being an Ordinance to hire Mr. Hill for \$580. to draft zoning Ord. for the Village of Centerville. Mr. Presbaugh made the following motion, " I move the statutory rule for Ordinances and Resolutions to be read on three separate and distinct days be dispensed with so that Ord. 5- 55 may be given its second and third readings," seconded by Mr. Poff and carried. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion. ~~The~~ Ord. 5-55 was given its second and third readings. The Question being, shall Ord. 5-55 be passed? It was moved by Mr. Dutcher, seconded by Mr. Neal and carried unanimously that Ord. 5-55 be passed. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

It was suggested by Mr. Poff that a 25 mile limit sign or Slow-Children sign be erected on Sheldon Drive
