Thereupon, Mr. Presbaugh introduced Ord. 5-55, An Ordinance to amend Zoning Ord. 5-53, which was given its first reading.

It was moved by Mr. Dutcher, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried that the owner of Moonlite Inn may let Miss Thompson

use the building as a dancing studio. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 4 ayes and one nay. Mr. Lyons voting nay.

Then Mr. Dutcher introduced Ord. 6-55, Being"An Ordinance to control, prohibit and make unlawful the creation or maintenance of loud, unnecessary, unnatural or unusual noises by wheeled vehicles in the operation thereof within the Village of Centerville," Mr. Schell made the following motion," I move the statutory rule for resolutions and Ordinances to be read on three separate and distinct days be dispensed with so that Ord. 6-55 may be given its second and third readings, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried. A roll call resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion. Ord. 6-55 was given its second and third readings.

The question being, shall Ord.6-55 be passed? It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Schell and carried unanimously.

A roll call was ordered which resulted as follows: Mr. Lyons, aye; Mr. Presbaugh, aye; Mr. Dutcher, aye; Mr. Schell, aye; Mr. Poff, aye.

Discussion followed concerning the passing of an Ordinance to prohit the burning of green wastes. It was tabled until later.

Mr. Todd expressed his desire to be paid on the 15th of the month for his convenience. The Council obliged his request.
