

Regular Meeting of Council

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in regular session Nov. 7, 1955 with Mayor Kelsey presiding. Present: F.C. Lyons, Kenneth Poff, William Dutcher, Don Schell, Richard Neal and James Presbaugh.

The minutes of the previous meeting, Oct. 3, 1955 were read and approved.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs amounting to \$127.60, State Court cases amounting to \$19.25, and Building Permits amounting to \$247.00, showing that the same had been paid in the Village treasury was submitted. It was moved by Mr. Poff, seconded by Mr. Neal and carried unanimously that the report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 eyes in favor of the motion.

Only one bid was received for East ridgeway as advertised in the Dayton Daily News. Roger H. Cowden Co. offered the bid at \$2306. Mr. Schell moved that the bid be accepted, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried unanimously. A roll call resulted in 6 eyes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Nathaniel Paulis was present to find out if some action could be taken to improve street conditions in Gorman Plat #3. From the discussion, the council empowered Mr. Lynn to renew performance bond for Gorman Plat #3 and to contact Mr.

Pyper concerning Virginia Avenue. Mr. Lyons made the motion that the Centerville Village Council authorize the solicitor to protect the interests of the Village and the interests of the citizens of Sheldon Drive against the expiration of the Street Performance Bond of Gorman Plat #3, with the provisions that proper engineering inspection be required of the streets before they are accepted by the Village, seconded by Mr. Neal and carried unanimously. A roll call resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Schell and carried unanimously that the following Street signs be
