Regular Meeting of Council

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio, met in regular session December 5, 1955, with Mayor Kelsey presiding. Present: F.C. Lyons, James Presbaugh, Don Schell, Kenneth Poff, Richard Neal.

The minutes of the two previous meetings were read and approved.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs amounting to \$51.30, State Court cases amounting to \$57.75, showing that the same had been paid in the Village treasury was submitted. It was moved by Mr. Schell, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried unanimously that the report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 5 eyes in favor of the motion.

Discussion followed concerning the radio communication of Centerville with Kettering Police instead of the County Sheriff's Office.
