The Street Committee made their report, particularly of the streets in the Boyles and Gorman Plats.

(1) Imporvements in plat "Boyles Addition to Centerville" as specified in paragraph 1 of contract between Mrs. Boyles and the Pyper Sand & Gravel Co. have been completed and are herewith accepted except in the following areas:

a. Curb and gutter at the southeast corner of Virginia

and Jeanette Avenues.

b. Curb and gutter at the northeast corner of Virginia and Jeanette Avenues.

Failure of the curb and gutter in these two locations appears

Failure of the curb and gutter in these two locations appears due to settling of backfill over the installed storm sewer. It is recommended that the replacement of the fractured curb and gutter be accomplished in the spring as further settlement may occur through the winter months. Replacement of the fractured curb and gutter, approximately 40 feet, is estimated at \$100. It is recommended that this sum be withheld from initial payment to contractor.

(2) In the Gorman Plat, the following corrections should be made before the spring paving of the streets.

a. On Hampton there is no inlet in the curb on the Northwest corner to take care of the surface water, and a catch basin should be installed at this point as specified in the plat street specifications.

b. The grade of the curb on the southwest cormer of H Hampton, will not let the water run away, and thus should be corrected

c. An underground tile from Lyons Dr. down to Sheldon and on to Dixson should be installed to relieve the drainage problem in that area. If gravel be placed in this wet and muddy areas would relieve the xxx driving conditions and also aid in forming a better base for the street.
