Mr. Lynn reported that workmen Compensation pertains to all Village employes except elected officials.

Mr. Presbaugh made the motion that the Village Solicitor be authorized to bring action in the Court of Common Pleas, Montgomery County against Harvey Benbow, Jr. for damages to Village Police Cruiser sustained in accident on Nov. 16, 1955. Discussion and remarks were given by the council and Mr. Lyons suggested the action wait for the new council and Mayor. Thereupon, Mr. Schell moved that the action be tabled until new council and Mayor take office, seconded by Mr. Lyons and carried. A roll call on the tabling motion resulted in 6 eyes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Neal moved that the Mayor and Clerk-Treas. be bonded by the American Surety Co. of New York, seconded by Mr. Presbaugh and carried. A roll call resulted in 5 eyes in favor of the motion. Mr. Lyons had previously left the meeting.

The Council gave James Smith authority ^{get estimates} to have radio communication equipment installed in new cruiser. The meeting adjourned, ^{until Mon. Jan. 2 at 11:00 A.M.}
