A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Todd was present and asked the Village for franchise to collect garbage within the Village limits. His request was refused.

The Mayor mentioned to the Council the possibility of passing a Civilian Defense Ordinance in the near future.

The clerk was authorized by the Council to request for advance of taxes on the April settlement, amounting to \$1000, so bills could be paid at meeting of April 5.
