Regular meeting of Council

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in regular session June 7, 1954, with Mayor Kelsey presiding. Present: F.C. Lyons, James Presbaugh, Don Schell, John Anthony, Kenneth Poff and R.H. Neal. Solicitor, James Lynn. Board of Public Affairs were Howard Gismond and C.W. Hosier. Visitor-Mr. Neubauer.

The minutes of the two previous meetings were read and approved.

Mr. R.H. Neal, appointed to the Council for the unexpired term of Donn Tippy, was sworn in by solicitor James Lynn.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs, amounting to \$41.20, State cases amounting to \$30., Building permits amounting to \$41., showing that the same has been paid in the Village treasury was submitted. It was moved by Mr. Poff, seconded by Mr. Schell and carried unanimously that the report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Mr. Schell, seconded by Mr. Presbaugh and carried that the following bills be approved for payment.

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Mr. Lyons reported for the street committee, the bid on the Fire Lane to West Franklin, 12' wide from Mr. Cowden was \$190. After discuccion that this would be done by the Village specifications having 2 layers of gravel or stone and 3 oil seals, It was moved by Mr. Lyons ,sedended by Mr. Poff and carried unanimously that the bid be accepted. A roll call resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion. It was moved by Mr. Poff, seconded by Mr. Presbaugh and carried unanimously that Mr. Cowden look over the the Village streetsfor patch work and repair, and the street committee be authorized to have the patching done to their descretion, not to exceed \$500. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Lynn stated that Mrs. Boyles attorney was to consult with Mr. Lynn concerning the progress in getting the Virginia Ave. problem settled.

Mr. Bill Sherman, representing the Civilian Defense, explained to the Village the advantages the C.D gives to the surrounding Villages under a central control. The main topics centered around the (1) the number of causalties that could be taken care of in Centerville, (2) centralization of equipment, (3) Village to maintain own organization, (4) Funds from municipalities used for operation and administration, and (5) the CD can furnish

equipment in case of natural emergencies such as fire trucks, water shortage, tornadoes, etc. The Council asked to see the break down of the CD\$98,000 budget, what would happen when the centralization is destroyed and what equipment could Centerville get. It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Schell and carried unanimously that Mr. Lynn prepare an ordinance to join the Montgomery Co. CD to be voted on June 21 at a call meeting. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 6 ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Gismond of the Board of Public Affairs reviewed the water situation in Centerville. After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Lyons that the Ord. for water restriction in Centerville be tabled until June 21 meeting, seconded by Mr. Schell and carried. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 5 ayes and 1 nay Mr. Poff voting nay.

The meeting adjourned.

The agreement ^{concerning Fire Protection} between the Village and Township Trustees was discussed again, the council thinking the agreement increasing fire protection cost from \$600. to \$900. ^{annually,} was not justifiable.
