

Regular Meeting

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in regular session Sept. 13, 1954 with Mayer Kelsey presiding. Present: Councilmen James Presbaugh, F.C. Lyens, Don Schell, Richard Neal, & William Dutcher. Mr. Burkhart of the planning Board, Visitors: Mrs. Elliott, Messrs. Wainscott, Barker, Tuvell, Bussard and Himes. Solicitor James Lynn.

The minutes of the August 9, 1954 were read and approved.

Mr. Lynn swore in William Dutcher as councilman, filling the vacancy in the Council by the resignation of Mr. Anthony.

It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Neal and carried unanimously that the following bills be approved for payment.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs, amounting to \$75.30, State Cases amounting to \$7.50, showing that the same had been paid in the Village treasury was submitted. It was moved by Mr. Schell, seconded by Mr. Neal and carried unanimously that the report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Mr. Lyens, seconded by Mr. Schell and carried unanimously that a resolution be sent to John Anthony for the appreciation of the Council for his services while he was Village Councilman. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Wainscott suggested street lights for the End of Weidner lane and Virginia Ave. The Light Committee was to investigate the possibility and report at next regular meeting of Council.

Discussion followed concerning the proposed Turnpike Mr. Burkhart and the Mayor were going to get more information concerning same from Mr. Cotton. The subject was tabled until Oct. 4.

Mr. Tuvell explained to the Council the Gridd system of numbering houses and suggested it would be the best system for Centerville. After discussion, Mr. Lyons moved that the Grid system of numbering houses be adopted in Centerville at a cost of \$355., the job to be completed in 4 weeks, completion date Oct. 11, 1954, seconded by Mr. Neal and carried unanimously. A roll call resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion.

A letter from members of the Masenic Lodge of Centerville was read to the Council. Mr. Burkhart was willing to establish the depth and grade for drainage of their property as requested in the letter.

Thereupon Mr. Lyons introduced Ordinance 7-1954, Being an Ordinance to repeal Ord. 6, and Ord. 6A- 1954. Mr. Schell made the following motion, "I move the statutory rules for Ordinances and Resolutions to be read on three separate and distinct days be dispensed with so that Or. 7-1954 may be given its second and third readings," seconded by Mr. Neal and carried. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion. Ord. 7-1954 was given its second and third readings. The question being, shall Ord. 7-1954 be passed? It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Dutcher and carried unanimously that Ord. 7-1954 be passed. A roll call resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Paul Will asked the Council to sell a parcel of land at the rear of his property now belonging to the Board of Public Affairs. The Council could not give Mr. Will a decision until the Board was advised of same, and a reply obtained from the Board.
