Regular meeting of Council

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in regular session with Mayor Kelsey presiding, 7:30 P.M. January 12, 1953. Present: Don Schell, James Presbaugh, F.C. Lyons, John Anthony and Kenneth Poff.

The minutes previous meeting were read and approved.

It was moved by Mr. Schell, seconded by Mr. Presbaugh and carried that the following bills be approved for payment.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs amounting to \$169.00, showing that the same had been deposited in the Village Treasury was submitted. The Mayor mentioned the change in Ohio laws concerning the filing for office for 1954. Petitions must be filed on or before Feb.4, 1953

It was move by Mr. Anthony, seconded by Mr. Lyons and carried that the following Resolution be accepted., "A Resolution to appoint Mr. James Lynn as Village Solicitor for 1953, \$25.00 per month to be paid semi-annually as a retainer fee, and this set amount is a minimum payment and the retainer to be first credited on subsequent billing, ". A roll call was ordered which resulted in 5 eyes in favor of the motion.

Mr. Lyons suggested to the Council that for any person digging up the streets, permission should be secured and a cash bond given with a time limit and after the time limit ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ has expired, the bond is forfeited to the Village who would finish the work. Mr. Cowden was to be consulted on the matter and specifications made for the next meeting.

The Council was to prepare a letter to send to The Dayton Power & Light Co. in accordance with rate changes in natural gas. It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried that this be done.

The passing of Ordinance No. 1-1953 was postponed until next meeting which was to be held on Jan. 26, 1953.

#### Special Meeting of Council

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio, met in special session with Mayor Kelsey presiding. <sup>Jan. 26, 1953</sup> Present: John Anthony, Donn Tippy, Don Schell, James Presbaugh and F.C. Lyons, who came before the meeting adjourned but not soon enough for voting on the issues. Mr. Lynn, solicitor was present.

Thereupon, Mr. Tippy introduced Ord.1-1953, being "An Ordinance to make Appropriations for Current Expenses and other Expenditures of the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31, 1953,"

Mr. Anthony made the following motion, "I move the statutory rule requiring Ordinances and Resolutions to be read on three distinct and separate days be dispensed with so that Ord. 1-1953 may be given its second and third readings," seconded by Mr. Schell and carried. A roll call resulted in 4 eyes in favor of the motion.
