

Regular Meeting of Council

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in regular session June 8, 1953 with Mr. Poff presiding. Present: F. G. Lyons, John Anthony, Kenneth P. Poff, James Presbaugh. Board of Public Affairs, Robert Killen, Howard Gismond and C. W. Hosier. Visitors were Mr. Ware Mr. Ware's contractor, Mr. C. W. Magsig and Adam Zengel.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as amended. The amendments were as follows: (1) The recommendation of the planning Board that \$5.00 be paid for the inspection of lay-out of house before construction is started and paid as regular bill, is not authentic because it was not voted on by the council. (2) Vouchers 61, 64, 65, and 66 for the payment of the mobile radio unit, its installation and generator, for the cruiser were not authorized by the council. (3) The words, "Mr. Lee Ware's letter" changed to read, "The Board's letter proposed ~~KYXM~~ for Mr. Ware," " ~~MAXX~~. These amendments were submitted By Mr. Lyons.

It was moved by Mr. Anthony, seconded by Mr. Lyons and carried that the following bills be approved for payment.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures, and Costs amounting to \$110.00, State Court Cases amounting to \$85.00; showing that the same had been paid in the Village Treasury was submitted. This does not include \$50. sent in to the Dayton Law Library. It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh, seconded by Mr. Poff and carried that the Mayor's report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call resulted in 4 ayes in favor of the motion.

Then Mr. Lyons introduced Ord. 9-1953, "Being an Ordinance to regulate the price which the Dayton Power and Light Company, its successors and assigns, may charge for natural gas in the Village of Centerville, State of Ohio, during the period of two (2) years, commencing on the effective date of this ordinance," The rule to give the second and third readings were not suspended. The Council decided to hold a meeting Monday, June 15, 1953, 7:30 P.M. to proceed with the passing of the Ordinance.
