

Regular meeting of Council

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in regular session with Mayor Kelsey presiding, 7:30 P.M. July 13, 1953. Present: F.C. Lyons, Donn Tippy, Don Schell, John Anthony, James Presbaugh. Solicitor James Lynn.

Visitors were Messrs. Kimmel, Neal Busse, Slade, Bennett and Glueckert.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Mayor's report of Fines, Forfeitures and Costs, amounting to \$82., Building permits amounting to \$25., and a check from the Dayton Law Library amounting to \$1.55. showing that the same had been paid in the Village treasury was submitted. It was moved by Mr. Presbaugh seconded by Mr. Tippy and carried that the Mayor's report be accepted and placed on file. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 5 ayes in favor of the motion.

It was moved by Mr. Tippy, seconded by Mr. Schell and carried that approximately \$1736 be appropriated from the St. Maint. fund to pave or resurface Lakeview and Linden Drive of the Pleasant Hill Plat #1, which will be paid out of current funds to be received from the State Auditor of Ohio and to be paid by Dec.31, 1953 from the St. Maint. Fund. Advertising for bids to be made accordingly in the Dayton paper. A roll call was ordered which resulted in 4 ayes and 1 nay. Mr Anthony casting the negative vote.

Mr. Richard Glueckert presented the Council with a signed petition to improve Virginia Ave. Mr. Lynn was to write a letter to the Boyles Estate concerning the matter.

The Mayor announce that the Mayor's salary ~~xxx~~ beginning Jan.1,1954 should be raised \$200., making the Mayor's salary \$500. per annum. No action was taken, to place the item on the Nov. ballot.

Call Meeting

The Council of the Village of Centerville, County of Montgomery and the State of Ohio met in a call meeting August 3, 1953, 8 P.M. with Mayor Kelsey presiding. Present: F.C. Lyons, Don Schell, John Anthony, Donn Tippy and James Presbaugh. Others present were Mr. Woolpert, Mr. Busse, Mr. & Mrs. Spisak, Mr. Billett, Mr. Turton, Mr. Tracy, Mr. Daugherty, James Smith, Mr. Hosier and Attorney Williams. *Mr. Peterbaugh, Mr. Shawen, Mr. Burkhardt of the Planning Board.*

The mayor opened the meeting stating the purpose of the call meeting, that is, reference to the closing of the alley from the Town Hall south to W. Franklin Street.

Mr. Williams then gave the legal aspect pertaining to the situation.

Mr. Woolpert speaking for the property owners stated that the property owners have the responsibility of the alley which is a hazard and the chief concern of the property owners in blockading the alley is for safety and protection of children and citizens of the town.

Mr. Woolpert was asked if the property owners would dedicate the land in this alley to the Village for a street? The answer was "no".
